

#### **TSYP ACCIDENT REPORT FORM**

This form should be used if a Teacher or Student suffers an injury or symptoms of a serious illness during a yoga class or consultation.

Insurers should be notified as soon as possible, when this form is completed after the event by referring it to the TSYP nominated person, **Health & Safety**, <u>vicechair@tsyp.yoga</u>. The report form is in 4 parts, each of which should be completed as far as possible.

Most incidents occurring within a Yoga environment will require a dual avenue of reporting by the Teacher. A report to the person in control of the premises and a duplicate to TSYP to fulfil Insurance and monitoring requirements.

If the incident results in hospital admission and falls under the terms of the RIDDOR Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 2013 then further action may be required by the Teacher.

# RIDDOR report is required only when:

- The accident is work-related (i.e. in the course of a Yoga consultation or class, its immediate preparation and dissolution).
- It results in an injury of a type which is reportable (see end of form for further information)

The list of 'specified injuries' in RIDDOR 2013 replaces the previous list of 'major injuries' in RIDDOR 1995. The list of 'specified injuries' in RIDDOR 2013 (regulation 4) includes the following and will need to be applied liberally to a Yoga work environment.

- A fracture, other than to fingers, thumbs and toes
- Amputation of an arm, hand, finger, thumb, leg, foot or toe
- Permanent loss of sight or reduction of sight
- Crush injuries leading to internal organ damage
- Serious burns (covering more than 10% of the body, or damaging the eyes respiratory system or other vital organs);
- Scalpings (separation of skin from the head) which require hospital treatment;
- Unconsciousness caused by head injury or asphyxia
- Any other injury arising from working in an enclosed space, which leads to hypothermia, heat-induced illness or requires resuscitation or admittance to hospital for more than 24 hours.

Reporting of Incidents to Health and Safety Executive will be undertaken by the person in control of the premises where the event happens. The Teacher will be responsible for being aware of the Health and Safety requirements of the environment in which they are operating and informing the Responsible Person of the event (unless one and the same) with a copy to TSYP.
